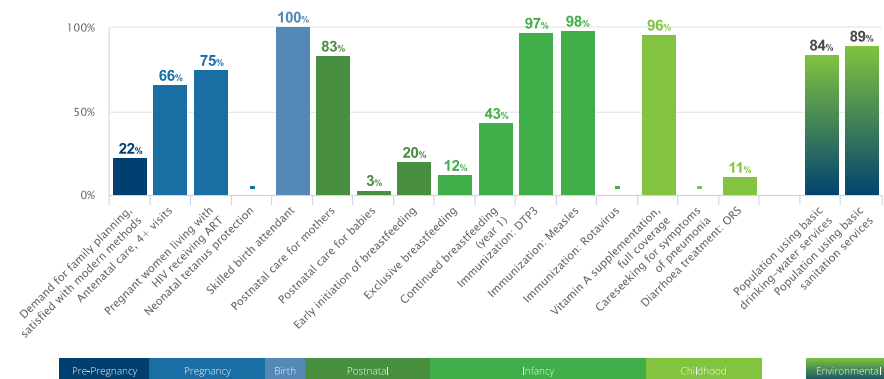
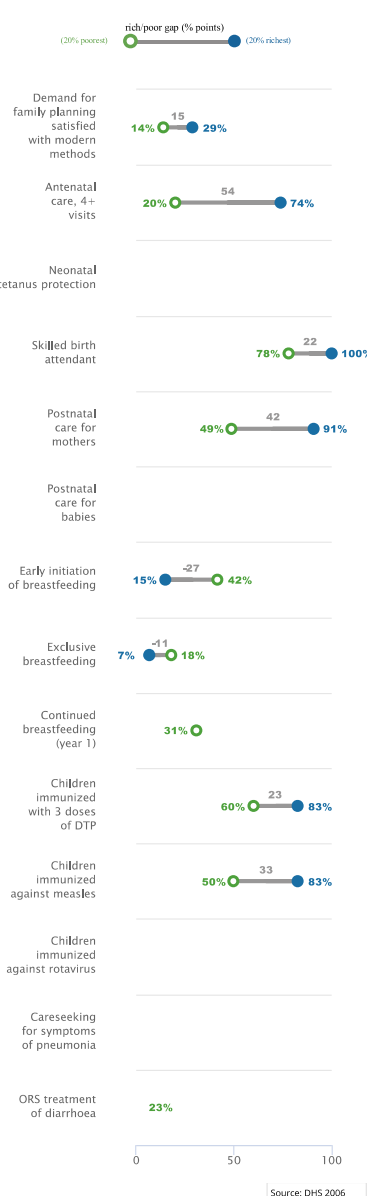


### Continuum of Care Coverage

Percentage of those in need receiving coverage of key interventions across the continuum of care



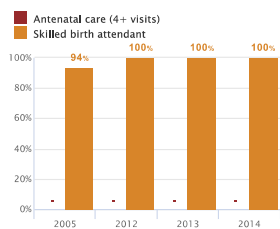

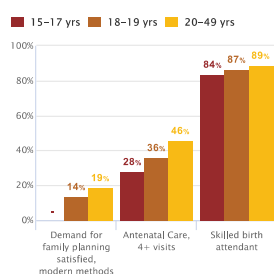

Percent women aged 15-49 years with:

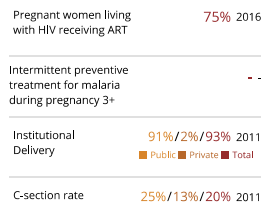

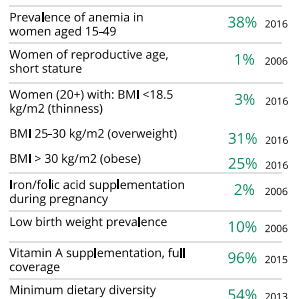

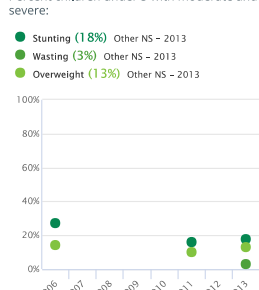

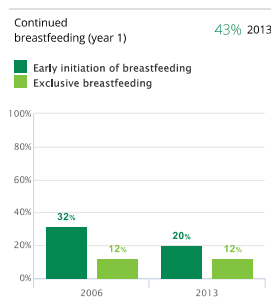


#### Child Nutritional Status

Percent children under 5 with moderate and severe:

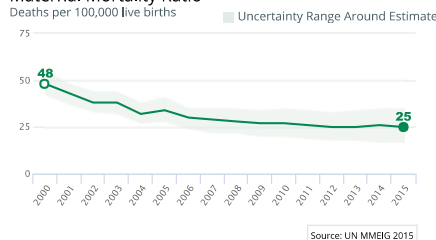

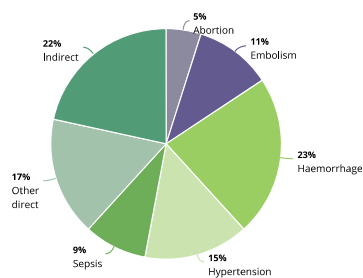

Maternal Mortality Ratio



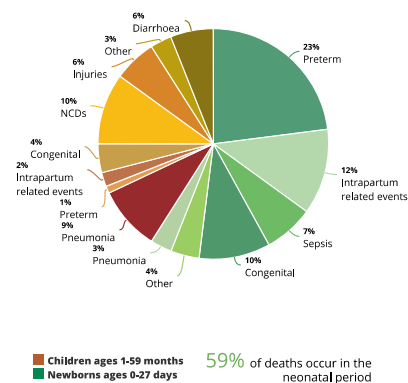
Causes of Maternal Death - 2014

Regional estimates for Caucasus and Central Asia

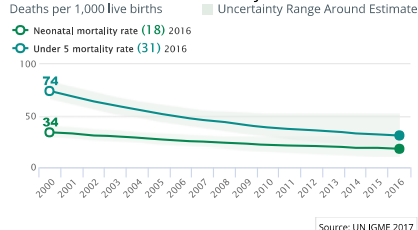


Causes of Death Under-Five - 2015

Neonatal & Under-five Mortality Rate

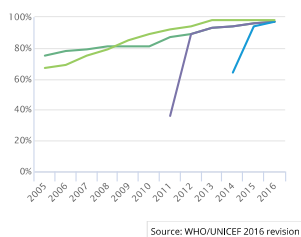

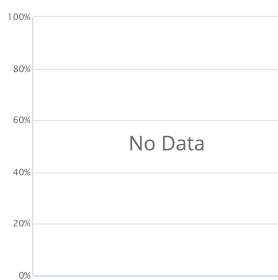

Pneumonia Treatment

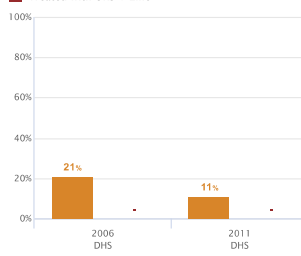
Percent of children under 5 years with symptoms of pneumonia taken to appropriate health provider



Diarrhoeal Disease Treatment

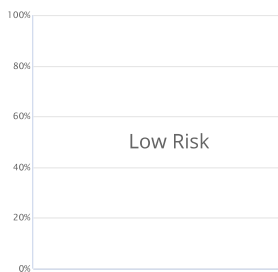
Percent of children under 5 years with diarrhoea:

Malaria prevention in children under-five - sleeping under ITNs

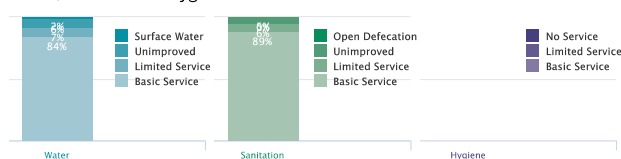


Malaria diagnostics in children under-five Low Risk
