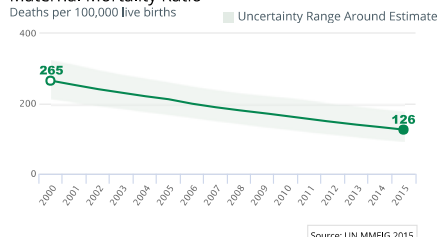

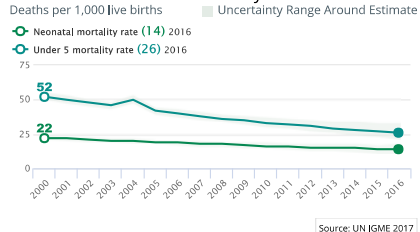

Maternal Mortality Ratio

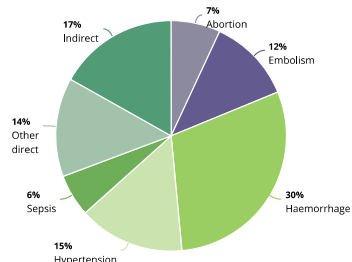


Neonatal & Under-five Mortality Rate



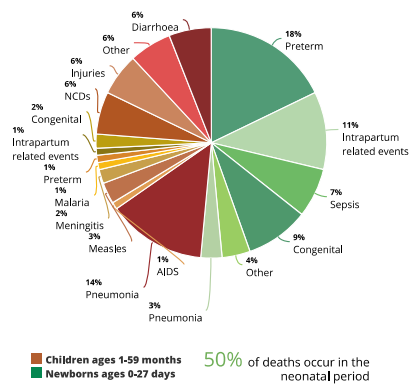
Causes of Maternal Death - 2014

Globally nearly half of child deaths are attributable to undernutrition

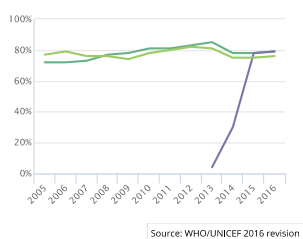

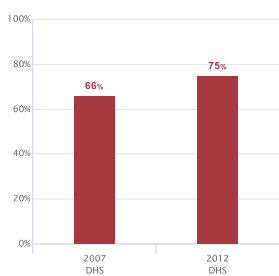

Pneumonia Treatment

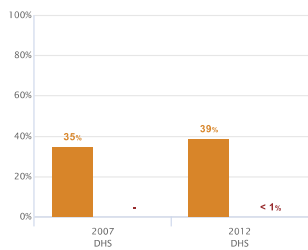
Percent of children under 5 years with symptoms of pneumonia taken to appropriate health provider



Diarrhoeal Disease Treatment

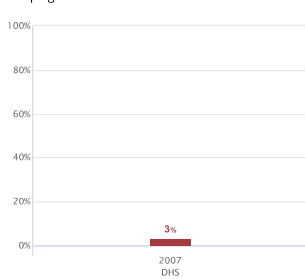
Percent of children under 5 years with diarrhoea:

- Treated with ORS + zinc



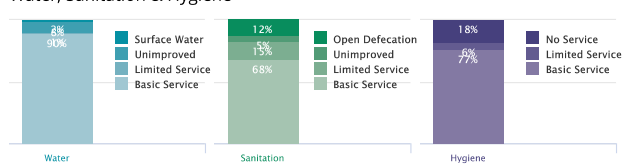
