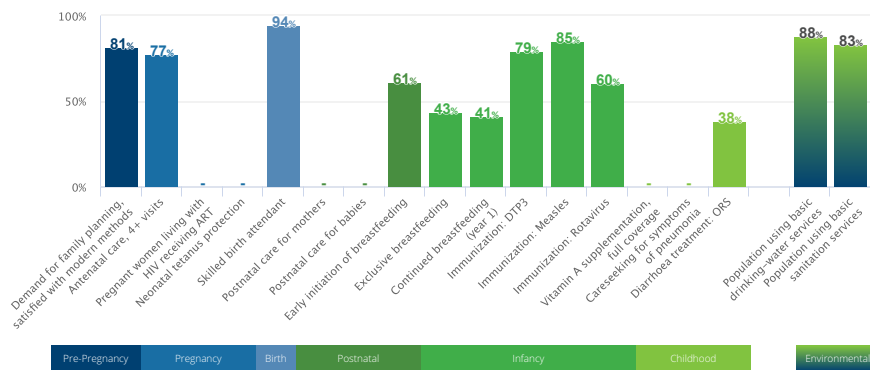

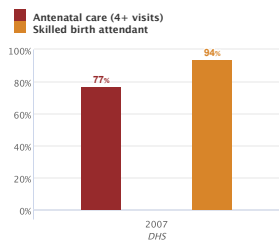

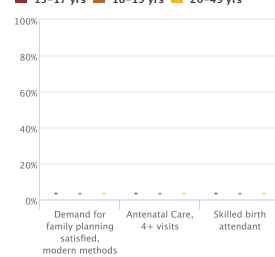

Percent women aged 15-49 years with:

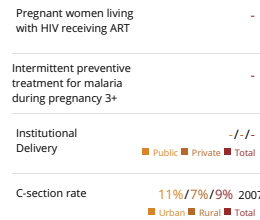

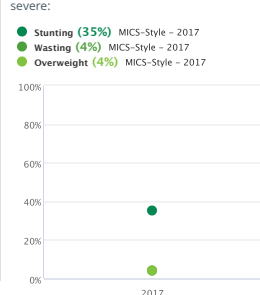

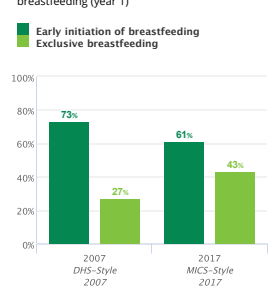

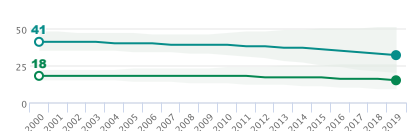
Neonatal & Under-five Mortality Rate

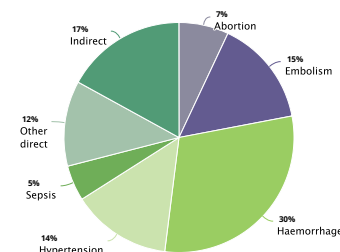

Causes of Maternal Death - 2014

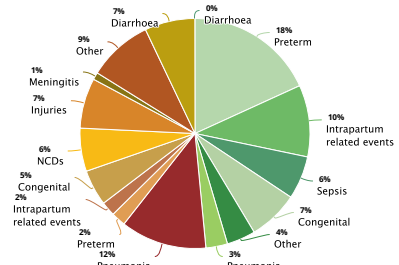
Regional estimates for Oceania

48% of deaths occur in the neonatal period

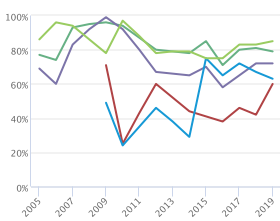

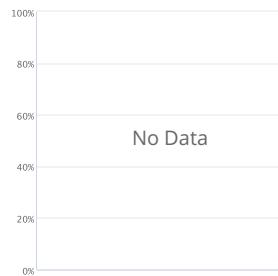

Pneumonia Treatment

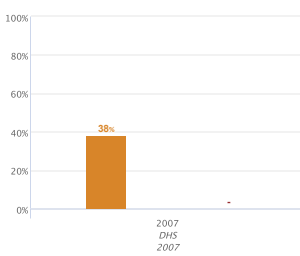
Percent of children under 5 years with symptoms of pneumonia taken to appropriate health provider



Diarrhoeal Disease Treatment

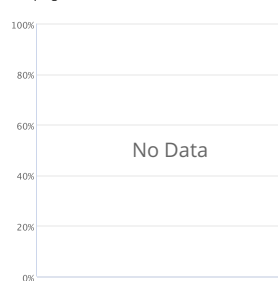
Percent of children under 5 years with diarrhoea:

Malaria prevention in children under-five - sleeping under ITNs

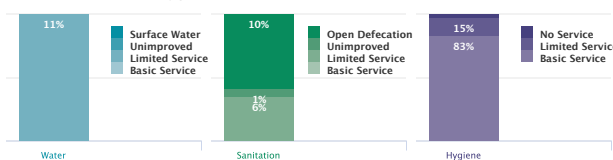


Malaria diagnostics in children under-five
